Topic: In Her Own Right: A Century of Women's Activism, 1820-1920

The *In her Own Right* project digitized and contextualized primary sources documenting women working for their own and other's rights in the 100 years leading up to the ratification of the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment in 1920. Designed both for students and scholars, the project gathered and described content that addressed issues of social justice, race and class, social services, religion, friendship, career, education, medicine, war and peace ... and, obviously, suffrage. Managed by a team from several Philadelphia Area Consortium of Special Collections Libraries members, in addition to ultimately including content from twenty-four institutions, the project was funded by five grants over the course of five years and has a robust web presence.
